Dear Parents & Carers,

Thank you for all your work towards the Cake Sale run by JD2 on Friday - it raised £107.36 which the School Council will send on to charity. Natural History Museum Trip - Friday 8 March

The coach will leave from outside the Tower Entrance at 7.15am prompt, and pupils should aim to **arrive between 7-7.10am** to allow time to register and visit the toilet. Please note that the bus will not wait as any delay leaving has an impact on the timings for the rest of the day. Pupils should be collected at **6.00pm** from the same location.

All pupils must wear full School uniform and bring a packed lunch and plastic bottle of water in a **disposable bag**. <u>Please do not send any containers or cutlery</u> - lunch should be in disposable packaging so the pupils do not have to carry empty containers or a water bottle around with them after lunch. We will be able to leave a bag and coat on the bus and just carry their "disposable" lunch and plastic bottle of water when we go into the museum. They may bring their normal water bottle to leave on the coach and they may also like to bring a snack for the return journey to help them last until teatime. Please ensure that there are no sweets at all, and not too many biscuits.</u> Pupils are welcome to bring a book, pack of cards etc. to use on the coach, but no electronic games or mobile phones please. We will be able to visit the museum shop so pupils may bring up to **£5** spending money with them, and they will need to keep this in their zipped blazer pocket throughout the day.

Cavepod - Wednesday 13 March 2024

We have arranged for the Cavebus people to return to School, this time bringing their newest addition, the Cavepod. This will allow children in small groups to experience the delights of caving, as they squeeze through the

artificial tunnels. Pupils will need suitable rugged clothing with them to wear for the activity, ensuring that legs and arms are covered. There is no cost to parents for this activity.

JD2 Hiking Trip - Friday 15 March

We have changed the venue to meet the needs of our cohort. This hike will start in Market Deeping and finish at Glinton Church. It involves very muddy terrain, so wellington boots would be ideal, or hiking boots. We will hike alongside the river, through lakes and woodland, through tunnels to a small river beach for lunch. We will then hike riverbank and country lanes to reach Glinton Church. There is no cost to parents for this activity

- Pupils should arrive in School in their hiking clothes.
- For our hiking trips we recommend that pupils bring a small backpack to carry their equipment. They will carry all their own items for the day and this makes it comfortable and keeps their hands free.
- Sturdy clothing from home to hike in, i.e. clothes that can get muddy, no jeans.
- Sturdy footwear, e.g. wellington boots or hiking boots
- Pupils will all need to bring a waterproof jacket and wear their **School hoody** for identification on the trip.
- Water, packed lunch and a snack. During our hikes we change the rule so that the snack can be something like a piece of cake, Twix or similar, doughnut or biscuits. Please do not send sweets or solid bars of chocolate.
- Some weather specific items may be needed, e.g. sunhat/suncream, warm gloves depending on the forecast.
- We ask all pupil to bring a plastic carrier bag, folded flat; this is handy to sit on if the ground is damp.
- If your child has a Chorister commitment at the end of the day, they will need to bring their full School uniform in a bag to leave at school and change into later.
