

## **FAQs - Entrance Examination for Year 7 Entry**

- Q Will we receive confirmation that the form to register our child to sit the Entrance Exam has been received?
- A You will receive an automated response to the email address used to register your child for the Entrance Exam. There is a registration document attached to this email with instructions for the day. Once you have submitted your registration form to The King's School by the closing date, you just need to bring your child along to the Entrance Exam on the day it is taking place.
- Q Will the car park be open on the morning of the Entrance Exam?
- A Yes the School car park, which can be accessed from Granville Street, will be open.
- Q Does the candidate need to bring any stationery or equipment with them?
- A No. As given in the Year 7 Entry Booklet, pens, pencils and erasers will be provided by the School for the candidate to use.
- Q Where can I find an example of the Entrance Exam paper?
- A An example paper can be found on The King's School website under Admissions, Year 7.
- Q Is the Entrance Exam equivalent to the 11+ Exam?
- A Yes.
- Q Are there any other practice papers that the candidate can refer to?
- A Book shops sell practice guides for 11+ Exams.
- Q Can parents / carers wait for the candidate whilst they take the Entrance Exam?
- A No. Parents / carers are asked to register their child and then return to pick them up at 12 noon.
- Q When will the results of the Entrance Exam be available?
- A Results will be sent to you via email on the Monday after the exam.
- Q Can I contact the School to receive the result before I receive the email?
- A Results are sent by email. If parents / carers have not received an email by the following Tuesday, then the School can be contacted for the results. Please check Junk / Spam folders before contacting the School.
- Q Can I apply for a place at The King's School under the academic criteria before my child has sat the Entrance Exam?
- A It is advisable to wait until the result of the Entrance Exam is known, to ensure that the child has met the minimum score requirement for the academic criteria B1.
