<u>Recipe of the Month: Fruit</u>

<u>Scones</u>

Ingredients:

200g Plain Flour

4tsp Baking Powder

1Tbsp Sugar

50g Butter

150ml Milk

100g raisins



Method:

Preheat oven to 220/220 Fan

Stir Flour, Baking Powder and Sugar together in a mixing bowl

Rub the butter and flour together using fingertips until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add raisins if desired.

Pour in the milk and mix until a sticky dough forms.

Dust a surface with flour and roll the dough until it is roughly 3cm thick

Cut out circles of the dough and place on a lined tray

Brush the top of the scones with milk and bake for 12-15 minutes
