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






EVE AINSWORTH ON WHY SHE WROTE LOST

I'M HOPING THAT BY RAISING AWARENESS AND EMPATHY AMONGST YOUNGER READERS, WE CAN HELP REDUCE THE BARRIERS THAT OLDER BOYS AND MEN FACE LATER IN LIFE. I'M ALSO HOPING THAT LOST WILL PROMOTE AND ADVOCATE THE POSITIVITY THAT SPORT - IN THIS CASE, FOOTBALL - CAN PROVIDE FOR THOSE WHO ARE STRUGGLING THROUGH EMOTIONAL OR CHALLENGING TIMES.

I TRULY BELIEVE THAT LOST IS A BOOK THAT DESERVES TO BE FOUND BY AS MANY YOUNG READERS AS POSSIBLE, AND I AM EAGER FOR YOU TO HELP US MAKE THAT POSSIBLE.
