Recipe of the Month

Since Valentine's day is coming up, we thought we'd share a recipe that's more romantic – Red Velvet Cake!

Ingredients

For the sponge:

310g plain flour 300g sugar

240ml buttermilk 215ml vegetable oil

115g butter 2 eggs

2 tbsp cocoa powder 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

1 tsp salt 1 tsp white vinegar

1-2 tsp red food colouring 2 tsp vanilla extract

For the icing:

300ml double cream 450g cream cheese

190g powdered sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract

Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 175°C.
- 2. In a large bowl, sift flour, cocoa powder, bicarbonate of soda, and salt. Stir and set aside.
- 3. In another large bowl, beat butter and sugar until smooth.
- 4. Add one egg at a time, beating until combined.
- 5. Add oil, vinegar, vanilla extract, and buttermilk, and beat the mixture.

Method

- 6. Gradually add the dry ingredients mixture from step 2. Ensure to continually mix, until batter is formed.
- 7. Pour the batter into two 20cm round baking pans, greased with butter, and dust with flour.
- 8. Bake for 35-40 minutes, until a knife or toothpick inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.
- 9. Leave the cakes to cool in their pans for 10 minutes. Then release them from their pans to cool completely.
- 10. Now it's time to make the icing. Put cream cheese into a large bowl with powdered sugar and vanilla extract. Beat until smooth and creamy.
- 11. In another bowl, whip the double cream to stiff peaks. Then fold it into the cream cheese mixture.
- 12. Cut the tops off the cakes so that they are flat on both sides. You can cut shapes (for example, hearts) out of the removed sections, or just make them into crumbs.
- 13. Lay out one layer of the cake. Spread an even layer of the icing across it. Lay the second cake layer on top and spread the icing evenly on top of that.
- 14. Decorate with the shapes you made, or sprinkle the crumbs on top.
- 15. Refrigerate for 2-3 hours before serving.
