## Recipe of the week!

#### Biscoff Cheesecake

#### For the base:

200g Biscoff biscuits

sog Melted butter

#### For the filling:

700g Cream cheese

100g Biscoff spread

50g Golden caster sugar

#### For the topping:

300g Biscoff spread

X2 crushed Biscoff biscuits on top

#### Method:

#### Step1

Start with base ingredients, crush the biscuits then melt the butter and combine! Tip into a tin, cover with spring foil and chill in the fridge for 20 minutes.

#### Step 2

For the filling, beat all the 'filling' ingredients together and spread evenly over the base (once chilled).

#### Step3

Leave in freezer for an hour and a half. Once set, decorate the cheesecake with Biscoff biscuits or spread as shown in

the picture below.








## Maths Society Composed to the Control of the Contro


## Gold award

Family, fear and extremism.


