## MONDAY 15 JULY TO FRIDAY 19 JULY 2019

In order to develop cross-curricular themes we take advantage of the post GCSE and 'A' Level period to re-organise the normal timetable for one week.

Pupils will follow a specially devised programme of activities which aims to:

- Motivate, inspire and stretch pupils and, hence, increase achievement
- Enrich and extend educational provision through cross-curricular activities
- Enable students to identify and experience a variety of teaching and learning situations and styles
- Encourage independent learning, study skills, research, transferable thinking skills and problem-solving approaches
- Emphasise individual and collaborative approaches to problems and learning
- Allow time for thinking, planning and production of work
- Address issues of PSHE and Citizenship

The week is divided between Gilwell Park, a visit to the National Holocaust Centre & Museum and an English based activity in School. Students will be divided into their half year groups '7K' and '7S'.

# THE GILWELL EXPERIENCE

Year 7 spend two nights at Gilwell Park.

Gilwell Park is set in 108 acres of beautiful woodland on the edge of Epping Forest, north east of London. The site is easily accessible from the M25, yet it still gives the feeling of being in the great outdoors. Gilwell Park is the home of Scouting in the UK. It's a large centre and boasts excellent facilities that rival an activity centre.

Pupils are divided into six activity groups, which are chosen by the staff involved. Each group works together in a number of activities, led by a qualified instructor.

Gilwell Park enables pupils to experience activities and tasks within small and large group situations.

The activities that the students will experience may include:

- Grass Sledging
- Climbing
- Raft Building
- Jacob's Ladder
- Archery
- Cycling

## The Journey Exhibition

We will partake in “The Journey Exhibition” which follows the story of Leo Stein, a 10 year old German Jewish boy, living with his parents and younger sister Hannah. We will be transported back to 1938 and follow Leo as his life changes, as it did for all Jews at the time. We will see where Leo lived; learn about his Jewish faith and where he went to school. We will learn why many Jewish people were forced into hiding and how others escaped. By learning about the impact of Nazi propaganda, anti-Jewish measures and anti-Semitism the exhibition ultimately asks visitors to consider how the Holocaust could ever have happened.

At the end of the tour we will have an opportunity to hear from a Holocaust survivor (dependent on their availability, health, etc., nearer the time). Since the Centre opened in 1995 many survivors have shared their stories. These stories along with their artefacts and historical information has been preserved so that their memories and testimonies will remain for future generations.

Our visit will fit in with our RS Year 7 Judaism topic and also the English Year 8 topic which examines the book “The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas”, and the Year 9 history topic on the Holocaust and Second World War.

Students **do not need to wear uniform**, but should be dressed appropriately. (e.g. NO crop tops, torn jeans, offensive T shirts etc.).
