





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In order to develop cross-curricular themes we are taking advantage of the post GCSE and A-Level period to re-organise the normal timetable for one week, from 6-10 July inclusive.

- benefit from visiting speakers and educational visits.
- extend and develop social groupings.

The School day will be re-organised to accommodate School-based activities; pupils who travel home by bus will be able to wait at School as normal.

It is assumed that your child will continue with their normal lunchtime arrangements (except when a packed lunch is required for the out-of-School activities). In School, lunch will be served at a different time as indicated on page 2.

Students will enjoy the Cadbury World main attraction and journey through the chocolaty zones.





Students will engage with Bletchley Park's story, its wider relevance to contemporary history and our own lives today. In an interactive workshop session they will use practical problem solving skills as they begin to understand the scale of the task faced by Bletchley Park's codebreakers during World War II.

Cyber Security: through interactive games and activities students will examine the lessons learned from Bletchley Park's Codebreakers and how they relate to being safe in today's connected world. They will explore the risks associated with having a presence in the online environment and discuss techniques to help keep themselves safe.
